

2017 Tribal Activities:

- Office of Child Care
 - Paiute Tribe: Supporting the tribe with the monitoring and background check requirements of the federal CCDF. The division has a MOU with the tribe to conduct this work.
 - Goshute Tribe: The Office of Child Care is working to establish a similar agreement as state above with the Paiute Tribe for meeting the monitoring and background check requirements.
 - Utah Navajo Commission: Conducted a meeting with the commission to begin discussing whether the tribe would like the Office of Child Care to discuss access issues on the reservation with the Navajo CCDF administrator.
- Intergenerational Poverty
 - Workforce Services staff introduced the Native American community of the state's efforts to address intergenerational poverty. It presented to the American Indian Caucus in February. In follow-up to that presentation, staff met with the Utah Navajo Commission to discuss this issue further and connect this community with the activities of San Juan County's Intergenerational Poverty Committee.
- Workforce Development Division
 - Ute Tribe:
 - Workforce Services presented three workshops on resume writing, interviewing and job seeking at their Career Fair in November 2016.
 - All Ute Tribe agencies were invited to attend Trauma training presented by Workforce Services last February. Tribal leaders requested additional training that was conducted in April 2017.
 - Workforce Services meets regularly with the Ute Tribe Enterprises management team to coordinate recruitment activities, grant applications, and plan job and career fairs.
 - Navajo Tribe in San Juan County:
 - Ongoing meetings with economic development representatives to assist with employment projects and proposals, coordinate programs and resources.
 - Sponsor and support local job fairs held at the Whitehorse and Monument Valley High Schools.
