

Utah State Library
Bookmobile Service
Internet and Online Access Policy
Approved by Utah State Library Board May 16, 2013

The Utah State Library (“USL”) works with counties to provide full library service to Utah residents within service areas defined by USL and each individual county served. As part of this service, USL provides computer and Internet access in repositories and on bookmobiles. The following policy defines the responsibilities of Utah State Library’s Bookmobile Service (“USLBS”) and the users of its computers and Internet access.

1. Application

1. This policy applies to all Utah State Library operated Bookmobiles, specifically the following units of USLBS:

Cache/Rich County Bookmobile and Repository
Carbon County Bookmobile and Repository
Iron County Bookmobile and Repository
Millard County Bookmobile and Repository
Multi-County Bookmobile and Repository
Sanpete County Bookmobile and Repository
Tri-County Bookmobile and Repository
Utah County Bookmobile and Repository

2. This policy is approved by the Utah State Library Board and is available for review by patrons on each Bookmobile, at each Bookmobile Repository and at the Utah State Library, online, and is intended to meet the requirements of Utah Code Ann. §§ 9-7-215 and 9-7-216, and Utah Administrative Code R458-2.

2. Internet Access


1. USLBS provides Internet access for public use on all of its Bookmobiles. Specific hours available, time limits, and sign-in requirements vary with individual Bookmobile service areas.
2. USLBS complies with Utah Code Ann. §§ 9-7-215 and 9-7-216, and Utah Administrative Code R458-2.
3. USLBS enforces a technology protection measure (filter) on all public use computers with Internet access, including staff computers, that: a) protects against visual depictions that are child pornography or obscene, and b) protects minors against visual depictions that are child pornography, harmful to minors, or obscene.
4. A library representative may disable the technology protection measure for an adult (any person over 17 years of age) upon request pursuant to Utah Code Ann § 9-7-215(4). Users violating this policy may: a) be required to end their computer usage and leave the bookmobile or repository, and/or b) be suspended from utilizing the bookmobile or repository, and/or c) face possible legal prosecution.

5. USLBS prohibits illegal activity on Internet accessible computers.
6. USLBS is not responsible for the content of materials accessed by users while on the Internet, intentionally or unintentionally.
7. USLBS staff monitors computer use, but parents are responsible for their children's Internet activities.
8. Administrative procedures and guidelines for staff concerning procedures to handle complaints about this policy, its enforcement, and about observed patron behavior have been adopted and are available for review at each Bookmobile, at each Bookmobile Repository, and at the Utah State Library.


3. Notice of availability The Internet and Online Access Policy will be posted in a conspicuous place in each bookmobile, repository library and online. Questions or concerns about this policy may be addressed to the Bookmobile Supervisor, or the Utah State Librarian, or the Utah State Library Board.

This policy was developed with the direction and approval of the Utah State Library Board as the means whereby the Board will meet the requirements of Utah Code Ann. § 9-7-215, and was adopted by the Board within three years of the last review in an open meeting held on May 16, 2013 to comply with Utah Code Ann. § 9-7-216(1)(a).
